## PREPARE

### Day Before the Net

Select at least one activity for this week's Net (simplex test, club announcements, trivia, tech conversation, contest info, ARRL updates, weather, or any amateur radio topic).

### 60 Minutes Before the Net

- B) Set out Roll Call names and call sign documents (or software).
- C) Be prepared to log guest names and call signs.
- D) Have pen and paper ready.
- E) Check your radio station, frequency, and power settings.

## PRE-NET

### <10 Minutes Before the Net>

"This is <your name and call sign>. In ten minutes, on the W6YDD repeater system, I will begin the weekly K6SAC Capital Radio Club Conversation Net. This Net occurs every Monday night at 7:30pm. Is there any emergency traffic or questions at this time?"

### <5 Minutes Before the Net>

"This is <your name and call sign>, Net Control Operator for this evening's Net. In five minutes, on the W6YDD repeater system, I will begin the weekly K6SAC Capital Radio Club Conversation Net. This Net occurs every Monday night at 7:30pm. Are there any questions, or stations needing an early check-in such as mobile stations? Please come now."

## MONDAY 7:30pm, START NET

"Welcome to the K6SAC Capital Radio Club Weekly Conversation Net. This Net occurs every Monday night at 7:30pm on the W6YDD repeater system. This is <your name and call sign>, your Net Control Station. Are there any stations with emergency traffic?"

<pause>

"We would like to thank the W6YDD Yabba-Dabba-Do Club for the use of this repeater, as well as Glenn Maclean WA7SPY and Kim Scheidel KE6RKX, trustees of this repeater system. There are three repeaters on this frequency operating independently at different locations. By request, participants in this Net typically use the Tone 2 repeater with a CTCSS tone of 123.00, which operates the Georgetown

repeater atop Bald Mountain. Although Tone 2 is preferred, you are welcome to use any of the W6YDD repeaters on this frequency.”

“We invite all licensed amateur radio operators to participate in this evening’s Net. This is a directed Net, meaning all traffic should be directed to Net Control — which this evening is me, <your name and call sign>. Appropriate traffic includes announcements, technical discussion, ham swap listings, trivia, weather, or any amateur radio information.”
